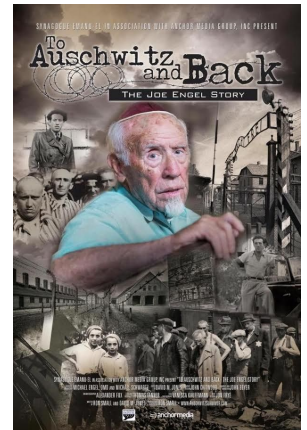

Born in Zakroczyrn, Poland in 1927, Holocaust survivor Joe Engel was taken by the Nazis at 14 and never saw his parents again. Now 90 years old, Joe is the embodiment of living history and spends his retirement years ensuring the Holocaust is never forgotten. From the overwhelming despair of the Warsaw Ghetto, to the shroud of unceasing death and suffering that was Birkenau and Auschwitz, to his escape from a death train at 17 and his covert work as a freedom fighter, Joe personally takes us on his vivid journey to hell and back. This is a story of faith, renewal and redemption. Joe Engel, with an unwavering will to live, overcame unimaginable horrors to become a treasured citizen, community leader, teacher, and philanthropist.

The older of two children, Judith was born Aug. 25, 1932, in Byton, Germany, to Jewish parents. Her father left when she was very young, and she was reared by her mom and grandmother. In 1941, her mom was picked up by local police, sent to Ravensbruck Concentration Camp and never seen again. Soon, her grandmother was removed from the home and placed in a ghetto, where she ultimately died.

Having no adults left in the house, neighbors took the two children in, but by year's end, they were placed in a "cloister convent," an orphanage, supervised by nuns.
