National Days of Remembrance

The US Congress established Days of Remembrance as the nation's annual commemoration of the Holocaust. It is led by the US Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington DC each year. Individual schools and organizations are encouraged to host their own community commemoration of the Holocaust and/or attend a local commemoration. It is scheduled to coincide with Yom HaShoah, the Israel Day of Remembrance each year. This year Yom HaShoah begins on Monday, April 20,
