


THE ANNE FRANK PARTNERSHIP AT THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA



Anne Frank: A History for Today (*High school*) is a 30-panel, bilingual, easy-to-assemble, traveling exhibit that tells the story of Anne Frank against the backdrop of the Holocaust and WWII.

Reading and Writing with Anne Frank (*elementary and middle school*) offers the opportunity to host an 8-panel traveling exhibition on the life and diary of Anne Frank for a period of four weeks.

Let Me Be Myself – The Life Story of Anne Frank reflects on subjects like identity, prejudice, and discrimination. The exhibition is the centerpiece of the international outreach work of the Anne Frank House.

Free2choose is a workshop that uses film clips to discuss how fundamental and human rights function in various situations.

Memory Walk is a workshop option that uses filmmaking to encourages youth to critically reflect on local memorials.
